




On average, per school year in 2018-2022, **213** students in rural Polk County experienced homelessness.

Prevention & Outreach

- Weekly outreach in partnership with ROCC, Community Action Agency, City Police Departments, and more.
- Has a data system that tracks all client information and situations.
- Resource Center provides a space for clients to receive mail.
- Polk Family & Community Outreach has 2 Resource Centers - one in Dallas & one in Monmouth.
- Has an outreach van to travel to clients. Takes visits to Grand Ronde, Falls City, Monmouth, Dallas, Independence, and Willamina.
- Meet with clients to see what the needs are and how we are able to assist.

- Goal to Rapidly Rehouse 50 households
- Weekly case management for clients
- Self-sufficiency is the end goal


- Part of the Polk County Family and Community Outreach Department; focused on prevention and addressing barriers that may be preventing youth from coming to school and being successful
- Serving students within the Dallas, Central,
 Falls City and Kings Valley catchment areas
- Staff are able to provide individual emotional support, group and individual skill building, crisis support, and connection with needed resources.
- Last school year served approx 1,300 students.



- School District documented houseless students in 2022-2023:
- Dallas SD: 74 students
- Central SD: 36 students


- Warming Center activates when temperatures drop below 32 degrees fahrenheit.



- Dallas Alliance Church and Polk County FCO partnership.
- Currently holds up to one household at a time.
- 3 bedroom transitional house with a full size kitchen, living room, and dining area.
- Families that stay at Ediger Hall work with Polk County Resource Center to secure stable housing upon exit.
- Family that stays at Ediger Hall is connected to all resources - Polk County Behavioral Health,
- Storage for belongings
- Hosted our first family, a mother and 3 kids. They had no other options beforehand. They are now successfully in long-term housing after 6 weeks of being placed at Edigar Hall.

Transitional Youth Home

- New transitional youth home opening in Monmouth by the end of the year
- Can house up to 5 youth
- Onsite case management, basic immediate need services, life skill building activities, etc.
- Positive Youth Development activities
- Only transitional youth home in all of Rural Polk County
- 24/7 staff onsite
- Connected to medical, dental, and mental health services

on-site services offered:

- 24/7 staff;
- one meal daily & 24/7 access to grab and go food and beverages;
- case management (40:1 ratio);
- Medical and behavioral health support, 2x weekly;
- DPSST licensed safety team support;
- Connections to public benefits (i.e. food stamps, TANF, SSI/SSDI, ID,
 - birth certificates, housing assessments etc.)




