➤ Homeless Prevention & Outreach data sharing. Some ideas/thoughts for the next data sheet: Adding a bar chart, showing new clients versus re-occurring clients, etc. Housing data numbers to come soon.

**Voting Members** 

- ➤ <u>City of Dallas:</u> Carson Commons up and in construction. Another 34 unit building about to start construction. 800 multi-family units in the queue in the next 5 years lots of which scattered across town.
- ➤ <u>City of Independence:</u> Re-visiting the homeless parking area. Kade Swarsher. 5 duplexes going in from Habitat for Humanity.
- Mid-Willamette Valley Community Action Agency: A long-term client of 7 years being homeless was housed at Redwood Crossings. Re-structured RRH program in Polk County Starting in October, they split the Salem office with half of them going to Polk County. Lots of the RRH funds for Polk County were for street homeless individuals now there's

- a funding stream that can assist those who are currently housed. Overall, it expands the number of people served. Purchased the Need-Navigator system and can now share access with Polk County Homeless Prevention & Outreach team.
- Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde: Just completed moving in families to first ever home ownership. 20 total houses that folks bought and people living in there. In 2025, will start on infrastructure for an additional 35 homes. Building 50 additional low-income and market rate apartments. A new design for a new recreation center with a rock wall, therapeutic pool, 2 full-court gyms, skate park, football park received a large grant which will pay for most of it 80% paid for. A new treatment center will be opening up in February. Adding a new detox center to Great Circle located in Salem. Stratus village project 20 new apartments available for membership. Overall, the need for housing will be decreased as all these new projects start up.
- Church at the Park
   Matt Smucker
  - Matt Smucker new role with Church-at-the-Park. Streaming of "No Place to Grow Old" will be hosted on February 19th at 6pm at Rice Auditorium. Opening 2 shelter sites really soon. Currently on track to open the Dallas site in December to host 2 families at a time with 12 beds adding an ADU building for 2 additional families in 2025. For the Monmouth site, the application for the City of Monmouth is submitted and in review. Public comment will be available as part of the process for Monmouth. Currently have 2 full-time outreach staff making connections in Rural Polk County. For Warming Center updates will blast out updates as the temperatures drop. Go to polkwarming.org to sign-up for updates. Safe Shower continuing at Life Church and will continue throughout the year, Monday, Wednesday, Friday from 9am 12pm.
- Homeless Alliance Team Update

- Elaine Lozier has decided to resign. New additional support staff have been hired by the Homeless Alliance. Some projects put forward for housing: Permanent Supportive Housing, Center for Hope & Safety, MWVCAA RRH & HOME Youth Services, and other programs will receive funding. Total ask is 5.5 million for these programs. Homeless Alliance looking to expand partnerships.
- PIT Count Updates

- ➤ PIT Count will be happening in the last week of January. A plan has been conducted and many community partners have come together to support the efforts.

- ➤ Polk County ROCC: Building got put up for surplus. Will be out by January 3, 2025. Looking for a new location to be at.
- ➤ <u>Polk County Behavioral Health:</u> Forensic Assertive Community Treatment (FACT), a treatment model for those experiencing extreme mental illness, is currently up and running working with 12 individuals. For aging adults, there's a new Adult Behavioral Specialist Laura Sloan. Crisis building still on target for Summer of 2025.
- ➤ <u>Polk County FCO:</u> Falls City Resource Center seeing about 20 people per week. Many services operate out of there and caseloads are increasing.
- West Valley Housing Authority: Not purging the list this year.
